LIGHTING**APPLICABLE**

For outdoor lighting service to individual Consumers where service can be supplied from existing secondary voltage facilities of the Cooperative.

MONTHLY RATE

As indicated in the Table on Sheets 2 and 3, effective January 1, 2026.

ENERGY COST ADJUSTMENT

The energy used (kWh used by each fixture) is subject to the Energy Cost Adjustment Clause.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. The Cooperative shall furnish, install, operate, and maintain the outdoor lighting equipment including lamp, luminaire, bracket attachment, and control device on an existing pole at a location mutually agreeable to the Cooperative and the Consumer.
2. If a new pole is necessary, additional charges will be assessed as indicated in the table on Sheets 2 and 3 or as determined by the Cooperative based on the quality of the fixture(s), capital costs, maintenance costs, availability, customer acceptance, and such factors. Span lengths to poles will be limited to 100'. Distances requiring more than 100' of overhead secondary will require additional poles and charges will be collected to reflect the number of poles. Western will supply to overhead secondary. Any existing customers may be grandfathered in at the Cooperative's option.
3. The Cooperative shall maintain the lighting equipment, including lamp replacement, at no additional cost to the Consumer.
4. The Cooperative shall not install or maintain any underground facilities.
5. Lamps shall be controlled by a photoelectric controller providing dusk to dawn service.
6. It shall be the Consumer's responsibility to notify the Cooperative when the lighting system is not working on the Consumer's premises.
7. The Cooperative will attempt, circumstances permitting, to service and maintain the equipment within a reasonable length of time from the time the Cooperative is notified of a maintenance requirement. The Cooperative assumes no responsibility for patrolling such equipment to determine when maintenance is needed. However, it is the Consumer's responsibility to detect and report failures and malfunctions to the Cooperative and, when such failures are due to vandalism, mischief, or a violation of traffic laws, or other ordinances, to assist the Cooperative in identifying the responsible party.

TERMS OF PAYMENT

Payment shall be in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Cooperative as they currently exist or may be amended from time to time.
